## Chaplain's Message

## Hope Is a Gift and Duty for Christians

The Jubilee 2025 officially begins on December 24, 2024, at 7 p.m., with the Opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica by Pope Francis. This is a regular holy year that occurs every 25 years. The theme for Jubilee 2025 is "Pilgrims of Hope."

Pope Francis writes that hope is a gift from God and a task that must be cultivated by all Christians. It's part of the introduction to his new book, "Hope Is A Light In The Night," which collects excerpts from various speeches by the Holy Father on the theological virtue of hope.

"The Jubilee of 2025, a holy year that I wanted to dedicate to the theme "Pilgrims of Hope," is a propitious occasion to reflect on this fundamental and decisive Christian virtue – especially in times like the ones we are living, in which the third world war being fought "piecemeal" that is unfolding before our eyes can lead us to assume attitudes of gloomy discouragement and ill-concealed cynicism," the Pope states.

Let us pray that the Jubilee 2025 may provide an impetus for a renewal of faith, hope, and love in the Church at different levels.

## **Devoted to the Heart of Jesus**

Eighteenth-century image of the Sacred Heart, now being restored by the Knights, will be the centerpiece of a new Pilgrim Icon Program

The Knights of Columbus is launching a new Pilgrim Icon Program in 2025 centered on the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The new prayer program — announced by Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly at the Organizational Meeting of State Deputies in June and at the 142nd Supreme Convention in August — coincides with the 350th anniversary of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque's visions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which began around 1674.

"Our Lord reminded [St. Margaret Mary] of that ancient and beautiful devotion, and she shared that gift with the world," said Supreme Knight Kelly during the Supreme Convention's annual States Dinner on Aug. 6. "In the heart of Christ, we see the heart of the Father, and we ask Our Lord to help us make his heart our own, so that we may see and love in others what he sees and loves in us. That is what the world needs. And on the 350th anniversary of St. Margaret Mary's visions, we will make this mission our own."

The Order's founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, had a deep devotion to the Sacred Heart, fostered in him from childhood: The McGivney family had in their home an ornate devotional plaque of the Sacred Heart that is still in the Order's

possession. In 1881, when Father McGivney accompanied convicted murderer Chip Smith to the gallows, Smith wore a Sacred Heart badge given to him by the priest. A century later, when Father McGivney's body was exhumed in 1981, it was discovered that he had been buried with a cloth image of the Sacred Heart.

The Knights selected a painting of the Sacred Heart by Italian artist Pompeo Batoni, located in Rome's Church of the Gesù, to be the centerpiece of the new pilgrim icon program. Copies of the image, blessed by the papal almoner, will soon be given to each K of C jurisdiction and, beginning in 2025, will travel from council to council, serving as the focus for prayer services throughout the Order.

During their visit to Rome for the unveiling of the newly restored baldacchino in St. Peter's Basilica, Supreme Knight Kelly and other Supreme Officers gathered Oct. 23 at the Church of the Gesù for a votive Mass of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus celebrated by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori. Jesuit Father James Conn, superior of the Pontifical North American College's Casa Santa Maria, concelebrated and gave the homily.

## **Spreading the Word About Cor**

Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly updates U.S. bishops on the Cor initiative and asks for their support

Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly addressed the annual plenary assembly of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in Baltimore Nov. 13, offering the Order's assistance in the bishops' evangelization efforts and asking for their support of the Cor initiative.

Amid the "modern crisis of isolation that comes from ruptured relationships," Supreme Knight Kelly said, "Catholics need places to grow in friendship with God and one another — places where they can commit together to answer our Lord's call to evangelize. This is the insight that led us to create the Cor initiative."

The Knights of Columbus launched Cor in 2023, first as a pilot program in 16 jurisdictions and later that year across the Order. Cor groups have now formed in more than 3,000 parishes to provide men — including men who are not Knights — with opportunities for prayer, faith formation and fraternity.

"Men of all ages are hungry for spiritual community. And we know many priests want to set up small groups to meet that need, but they can't quite do it on their own. Cor is the solution," the supreme knight told the bishops. "It enables priests to draw on the structure and resources of the Knights of Columbus, getting small groups off the ground quickly, and — importantly — sustaining them over time."

The supreme knight asked the bishops for their help spreading the

word about Cor in the dioceses and among their priests, and promised that the Knights will continue to carry out Blessed Michael McGivney's mission in support of the Church and the family.

He concluded, "To all of you, our bishops, we thank you for your support and recommit ourselves to standing in steadfast solidarity with you. And as always, we pray for you, just as we count on your prayers for us."

USCCB president Archbishop Timothy Broglio thanked the supreme knight for his remarks, adding that Cor "certainly falls very well in this time of New Evangelization and in this time of synodality."

In his presidential address to the plenary assembly the previous day, Archbishop Brolio also commended the Knights of Columbus for its humanitarian work in Ukraine. The archbishop, who leads the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA, visited the war-torn country in December 2022.

"With my own eyes I saw what the Knights of Columbus were doing on the ground in Ukraine," Archbishop Broglio said, adding, "What was born of concrete needs for widows in the 19th century still serves today for formation, charitable action, and authentic patriotism."




